# PACE PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Throughout the past 30 years PACE has been a forerunner in training community members, offering excellent client services, and helping to build a stronger, healthier community. PACE believes that everyone dealing with or experiencing crisis/trauma has the right to access skilled, caring and professional services. We BELIEVE that every person has dignity and deserves to be treated with respect, without discrimination and judgement.

## Child Abuse Treatment Program:

This program provides therapy for children (5-17 yrs) as well as families who have been traumatized & involved in intra and extra familial sexual abuse. The program offers a range of support services to youth and families with Child Welfare/Family Enhancement Status. These services are provided in Grande Prairie and Valleyview.

## GENESIS Program (Adult Sexual Abuse Treatment Program):

The Genesis Program provides therapy to adults sexually abused as children. Services may include one-on-one therapy as well as an opportunity to participate in a variety of groups. Groups offered through the Genesis Program are: informational, psycho-educational, and therapeutic. Services are offered in Grande Prairie & Peace River.

## Community Program:

The Community Program provides support services to children, youth and adults who have been traumatized and sexually abused. Services may include one-on-one counseling, couple therapy or educational sessions. Services are offered in Grande Prairie and Peace River.

## Family Support Program:

This program provides a range of support to youth and families with Child Welfare/Family Enhancement Status. Services include in-home support, supervised visits, youth work, drop-in assessment, respite and driver escorts. This program provides services in Grande Prairie, Beaverlodge, Central Peace Region, Valleyview and Grande Cache.

## Peace Country Wilderness Program:

The Wilderness Therapy Program is designed to facilitate emotional growth opportunities for youth. The program combines challenging outdoor adventures, therapy and group work.

## PACE CISM Team:

The PACE CISM (Critical Incident Stress Management) Team is comprised of volunteers who provide a 24/7 response service for our region. Call 780.832.7788 to access the team. The team provides a coordinated, comprehensive crisis intervention service following a traumatic event that has an overwhelming impact on a group of people.

## Safe Visitation Program:

This program serves families who have existing safety concerns relating to custody and access issues due to previous and/or current family violence. Given that violence often escalates following separation, this program helps reduce the risk of future abuse during visits and exchanges by closely monitoring all contact between the visiting parent and child(ren).

## Public Education Program:

The Public Education Program provides presentations which focus on childhood sexual abuse and sexual violence. PACE is proud to provide the "Who Do You Tell?" Program to area schools. Presentations are based on community need and can be modified or tailored for any audience.

## Women's Drop-In Support Group:

This group is held every TUESDAY evening from 6:30 PM - 8:30 PM at the PACE Building (10031 - 103 Ave). This group provides support, information and resources in a number of different areas including: developing and maintaining healthy relationships, setting limits/boundaries and building confidence. This group provides an opportunity for women to connect in the community.
